Programs offered through the Career & College Readiness Center are research-informed youth development practice, training and experiential learning opportunities that lead to first job readiness and a plan for pursuing post-secondary and/or career aspirations. In doing so, our Boys & Girls Club is poised to directly impact the development of Lowell's future workforce.






Career & College Readiness Programs Include:

CareerLaunch – Teens enrolled in CareerLaunch learn essential workplace skills, including active listening, goal setting, appropriate work behaviors, collaboration, problem solving, professionalism, and giving and receiving feedback.

Money Matters – Emphasizes goal setting, budgeting, saving and investing for college and retirement, and using credit wisely.

Diplomas2Degrees (d2D) – Teens practice career research, college research, and interviewing skills. They develop college portfolios with a resume, cover letter, LinkedIn profile, and letters of recommendation. **Junior Staff Program –** Recruited teens will interview and complete a Junior Staff orientation before their service in areas such as tutoring younger youth with their homework, assisting the Front Desk, refereeing Games Room tournaments, or helping to set up activities in the Gym. **Leaders in Training –** Our Leaders in Training complete volunteer service in the community and have the opportunity to earn monthly stipends.
